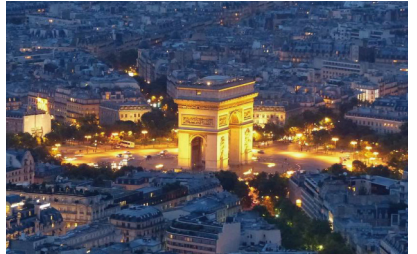

DAY 1 Paris (07.22)

Transfer to hotel upon arrival. Free time at your leisure.

Free pick-up at Paris CDG airport is available on the day from 8-22 o'clock.

Optional: In-depth tour of Paris, €80/person (from 6 people, customers need to land before 12PM on the this day)

DAY 2 Paris (07.23)

[Eiffel Tower] (exterior visit): one of the symbols of Paris, the Eiffel Tower is one of the most famous towers in the world and offers magnificent panoramic views of the city;

Notre-Dame Cathedral (exterior visit) : this Gothic church is a landmark of Paris, with a long history and architectural value;

[Arc de Triomphe] (exterior visit) : one of the most famous monuments in Paris and France, symbolising the glorious achievements of the French army.

Seine River Cruise (Activity Package), one of the most iconic tourist experiences in Paris, takes visitors on a beautiful tour of Paris on this famous river.

[Versailles] (Activity Package) is a palace in the south-west of Paris, France, famous for its magnificent architecture, exquisite gardens and rich history. Originally started as a hunting lodge by Louis XIII in 1623, Versailles was later expanded into a palace by his son Louis XIV in 1661. The palace became the main residence of the French kings and a symbol of the absolute monarchy of France. The Palace of Versailles was built in the Baroque style and the architectural design was carried out by the architect Louis Le Vau, who was later joined by other architects. The palace's architecture is unique, full of luxury and grandeur, showing the power and splendour of the French kingship in the 17th century. The palace consists of the main building and the gardens, which have several palace wings, the most famous of which is the "Hall of Mirrors", a sumptuously decorated hall with mirrors, which used to be the venue for important international meetings and the signing of important treaties.

DAY 3 Paris – Brussels (07.24)

Brussels is the capital of Belgium and the seat of the European Union's main administrative organisation, hence the name 'Capital of Europe'. Ideally located in the centre of Belgium, Brussels is a city where history and modernity are intertwined. Brussels is not only the political centre of Belgium, but also known for its rich culture, architecture and gastronomy.

[Grand Place] (Exterior visit), Brussels' iconic attraction, surrounded by ornate Gothic and Baroque buildings and listed as a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

[Pissing Boy] (Exterior visit), a small bronze statue that is one of the symbols of Brussels, although small, it is very famous and symbolises the sense of humour of the people of Brussels.

[Atomic Sphere Tower] (Exterior visit), an exhibit at the 1958 Brussels World's Fair, representing a model of the atomic structure, now an important part of the city's skyline.

DAY 4 Brussels – Antwerp – Rotterdam (07.25)

[Antwerp] Belgium's second largest city, is also an important port and cultural centre. Located in the Flemish region of northern Belgium, Antwerp is known not only for its busy harbour, but also for its position in the diamond trade, fashion and the arts.

[Antwerp Cathedral of Our Lady] exterior tour. This Gothic cathedral is one of the tallest churches in Belgium and a UNESCO World Heritage Site, and houses several of Rubens' famous paintings. **[Rotterdam]** the second largest city in the Netherlands and one of the most important ports in Europe and the world. It is located in the Dutch province of South Holland, near the North Sea, and is known for its modern architecture and vibrant urban atmosphere.

[Kijk-Kubus Museum-house] exterior tour, a futuristic set of tilted cube-shaped buildings designed by renowned architect Piet Blom.

[The Great Market] one of Rotterdam's landmarks, combines multiple functions such as shopping, living, dining and art. The Big Market is not only a place for locals and tourists to buy fresh ingredients and enjoy good food, but also attracts a large number of architecture enthusiasts due to its unique design.

[China Town] located in the centre of Rotterdam, is one of the larger Chinese neighbourhoods in the Netherlands. This vibrant neighbourhood is not only a symbol of Chinese culture, but also an important area to showcase Rotterdam's multicultural fusion.

DAY 5 Rotterdam – Zaandam – Giethoorn – Amsterdam (07.26)

After breakfast at the hotel, today's itinerary begins at 8:30 AM. Zaandam is a city brimming with historical and cultural charm, located approximately 15 kilometers from Amsterdam. The "Three Treasures of the Netherlands" typically refers to three of the most representative features of the country: windmills, cheese, and wooden shoes.

Windmills are one of the symbols of the Netherlands and a representation of Dutch engineering ingenuity. Historically, windmills served multiple purposes, most importantly helping the Dutch drain water from low-lying areas and prevent flooding. They were also used in industrial applications such as flour milling, sawing wood, and oil production.

Cheese is a world-renowned specialty of the Netherlands, boasting a long history and a rich variety. Gouda cheese is one of the most famous types, named after the city of Gouda in southern Netherlands. Gouda cheese has a smooth texture and is suitable for various aging stages.

Wooden shoes are a traditional Dutch handicraft and an integral part of daily life for working people. They were originally used in agriculture and fishing, where waterproof and durable materials were essential. Although wooden shoes are no longer worn daily by modern people, they remain an important symbol of Dutch traditional culture.

Giethoorn, a beautiful and unique village, is often called the "Venice of the Netherlands" or the "Venice of the North." It is renowned for its crisscrossing canals, tranquil natural environment, and unique layout without traditional roads, making it one of the most popular tourist destinations in the Netherlands.

Giethoorn boat tours (Activity packages), highlight the village's distinctive waterway network. With almost no regular roads for cars, the main modes of transport are boats and bicycles. Visitors can rent boats or join boat tours to cruise along the clear canals, admiring the che-d-roof traditional Dutch houses, gardens, and bridges lining the village's banks.

DAY 6 Amsterdam (07.27)

Amsterdam, the capital and largest city of the Netherlands, is renowned for its unique network of canals, rich history, world-class museums and diverse culture. Blending old European flavour with modern urban vibrancy, Amsterdam is one of Europe's most popular tourist destinations.

[Van Gogh Museum] self-pay Optional inside visit, the world's most comprehensive collection of works by the famous Dutch painter Vincent van Gogh. Founded in 1973, the museum showcases Van Gogh's paintings and drawings as well as related documentation. It is not only a haven for art lovers, but also one of the most visited museums in the world.

[An Amsterdam cruise] (Activity Package) is one of the best ways to experience the city's charms. With more than 165 canals totalling over 100 kilometres in length, Amsterdam is also known as the "Venice of the North". A cruise along these historic canals offers a new perspective on the city's unique landscape, architecture and history.

[De Wallen, Red Light District] (Activity Package). One of the world's most recognisable red light districts, known for its open sex industry and nightlife, attracts a large number of tourists to explore. Despite being known for its sex industry, the Red Light District is also a diverse area with a rich culture and history.

DAY 7 Amsterdam – Cologne – Bonn (07.28)

Cologne is situated on the banks of the Rhine and belongs to the state of North Rhine-Westphalia. Cologne is known for its long history, cultural heritage, iconic architecture and vibrant art scene. As one of the oldest cities in Germany, Cologne is not only an economic and transport centre, but is also noted for its rich cultural and religious history.

[Cologne Cathedral Kölner Dom] (exterior visit), one of Cologne's most famous landmarks and one of the largest Gothic churches in the world. The Cologne Cathedral, famous for its majestic twin towers, is a UNESCO World Heritage Site. The church is home to the precious "Sacred Bone Box of the Three Kings of the East", which attracts a large number of religious pilgrims and tourists.

Bonn is a historic city in North Rhine-Westphalia, Germany, located on the banks of the Rhine River. Bonn was the capital of West Germany (Federal Republic of Germany) from 1949 to 1990, and even after German reunification, remained politically and culturally important as the seat of many federal government agencies.

[Beethoven's House] (exterior visit), a well-preserved 18th-century building typical of the Rhine region, is located at Bonngasse 20 in the centre of Bonn. Beethoven was born here on 16 December 1770 and spent his childhood here. The house has been open as a museum since 1889. The Beethoven House Museum is one of the world's most comprehensive displays of Beethoven's life and work, with a large collection of precious objects and documents relating to the composer's life and work.

Hotel: Vienna House Easy by Wyndham Trier or similar hotel **Meals:** Breakfast

DAY 8 Luxembourg - Champagne (07.29)

Luxembourg, a small country in Western Europe, may be small in size, but it has a rich history, a unique culture and stunning natural beauty. Known as the 'Land of a Thousand Castles', Luxembourg is famous for its medieval castles, its status as the financial centre of Europe, and its Old Town, a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

[Grand Ducal Palace] (exterior visit), the official residence of the Grand Duke of Luxembourg, in magnificent Renaissance style. Although the palace is closed to the public for most of the year, summer visitors can take a guided tour.

Place de la Constitution (exterior visit), overlooking the Petrus Valley, Luxembourg's landmark site, where visitors can enjoy beautiful views of the gorge, bridges and surrounding area.

[Champagne cellars visit and taste] (ages above 5, Activity Package) the only region in the world where the production of 'champagne' is permitted under this name. The cellars of Champagne are not only one of the most famous wine cellars in the world, but also represent the best of French winemaking tradition and culture. These cellars, most of which are located in the centre of Champagne in cities such as Reims, Epernay and Troyes, are an important part of the World Heritage and attract many wine lovers. The province of Champagne is home to a number of world-renowned Champagne houses, many of whose cellars are open to the public. Visitors can take a guided tour of the cellars, learn about the process of champagne production and taste the different types of champagne. One of the highlights of a visit to a Champagne cellar is participating in a Champagne tasting. Each winery usually has several different vintages and styles of Champagne for visitors to taste, and the narrator will explain the characteristics of each Champagne, how to taste it and how to pair it with food.

DAY 9 Paris (07.30)

Louvre (Activity Package): one of the largest art museums in the world, with a vast collection of art treasures, including the Mona Lisa and the Triumph of Venus;

Basilique du Sacré-Coeur Exterior visit it is widely noted not only for its unique architectural style and religious significance, but also for the Montmartre Heights on which it stands, offering an excellent view over the whole of Paris. With free time for shopping.

DAY 10 Paris – Dijon (07.31)

Dijon is a city in eastern France and is the capital of the Cordon department and the Burgundy-Franche-Comté region. The city has a rich history, having been the seat of the Dukes of Burgundy and thus amassing great wealth and power. Dijon Cathedral (exterior visit), a historic church in Dijon, France, famous for its unique architectural style and artistic value. It has witnessed many centuries of historical change and is an important landmark for exploring the city's religious and cultural heritage.

Palace of the Dukes of Burgundy (exterior visit), a historic building in Dijon, France, which was once the palace of the Dukes of Burgundy. It bears witness to the rich history and culture of the region and is now a museum displaying artefacts and historical artefacts. The palace is known for its spectacular architecture and fine art collection.

DAY 11 Dijon – Colmar – Bern (08.01)

Colmar is a charming town in the Alsace region of northeastern France. Known for its well-preserved old town, colorful half-timbered houses, and picturesque canals, it is often called "Little Venice."

Maison des Têtes A historic building dating back to 1609, famous for its ornate facade decorated with over 100 carved heads.

Quai de la Poissonnerie - This historic area of Colmar, also called the Fishermen's Quarter, features colorful half-timbered houses along the canals. Once home to local fishermen, it now offers a charming atmosphere for walking, taking photos, and enjoying the picturesque canals.

Maison Pfister (exterior visit) Built in 1537, Maison Pfister is an iconic Renaissance house in Colmar, famous for its wooden galleries, frescoes, and elegant architecture. Its whimsical design and historic charm are said to have inspired the scenery in the animated film Howl's Moving Castle by Studio Ghibli.

Clock Tower (exterior visit), the clock tower is equipped with a medieval astronomical clock and figurines are performed every hour.

Federal Palace (exterior visit), Located on Bern's Parliament Square, it is a stately building that offers regular free guided tours to inform the public about the Swiss political system.

The Old Town, UNESCO World Heritage Site, is famous for its well-preserved medieval buildings, cobblestone streets and iconic fountains. Set on a peninsula from the Aare River, the Old Town is the perfect place to explore the city's history.

Hotel: ibis Styles Bern City or similar hotel **Meals:** Breakfast

DAY 12 Bern – Interlaken – Italian town (08.02)

Go to Jungfrau (optional, self pay), climb to the top to see the magnificent vastness of Europe's longest 23 kilometres of the Aletsch glacier and the beauty of the Jungfrau peaks from afar, footsteps on the millennium of glacier, between the peaks, can not help but the luxury of a small world. The Jungfrau Railway, known as the greatest mountaineering project, was completed a hundred years ago. It runs along the north wall of the Eiger Peak and takes only 15 minutes to reach the Eiger Ice Station, which has a height difference of more than 1,000 metres, and has no intermediate stops in the middle of the line, which is a milestone and a masterpiece of the Swiss transport system.

Hotel: Novotel Milano Malpensa Airport or similar hotel **Meals:** Breakfast

DAY 13 Milan – Venice (08.03)

Duomo di Milano (exterior visit) Located in the centre of Milan, the Duomo di Milano occupies the site of the original church of Santa Maria Nasco En de Maggia and is the city's landmark. This church is a masterpiece of Gothic architecture, with its elegant and stately architecture.

Galleria Vittorio Emanuele I, A famous shopping centre in the centre of Milan, Italy, known as the "living room of Milan". It is one of the oldest shopping centres in the world and one of the most iconic buildings in Milan.

Verona Arena (exterior visit) A remarkably well-preserved Roman amphitheater from the 1st century AD, still used today for opera performances and concerts. It is one of the largest and most famous ancient arenas in Italy.

Juliet's House (exterior visit) Famous for the balcony associated with Shakespeare's Romeo and Juliet, visitors come here to see the balcony, the statue of Juliet, and leave love notes on the walls.

Piazza delle Erbe (exterior visit) The historic heart of Verona, this lively square is surrounded by colorful medieval buildings, markets, cafes, and fountains, offering a vibrant atmosphere for sightseeing and relaxation.

Hotel: Four Points by Sheraton Padova or similar hotel **Meals:** Breakfast

DAY 14 Venice – Pisa (08.04)

Piazza San Marco, one of the most famous squares in Venice, is considered the centre of the city. The square is home to St. Mark's Basilica and bell tower, one of Venice's most important religious and cultural landmarks.

St. Mark's Basilica (exterior visit), one of the grandest churches in Venice, known for its Byzantine and Gothic architectural styles as well as its gilded interior. **Ponte dei Sospiri**, Connect the Doge's Palace with the New Prison. Because it is said that when prisoners were taken to the prison, they would sigh at the view of Venice from the bridge.

One of Pisa's most famous attractions is the Leaning Tower of Pisa, a white marble-built bell tower famous for its pronounced tilt. The Leaning Tower is part of Pisa Cathedral and together they form Piazza dei Miracoli.

Hotel: AC Hotel by Marriott Pisa or similar **Meals:** Breakfast

DAY 15 Pisa – Florence (08.05)

Santa Maria del Fiore (exterior visit), one of Florence's most famous buildings, known for its massive dome and magnificent facade.

Uffizi Gallery self-pay (inside visit) : built in 1560. It began as the offices of the Municipal Judiciary (Uffizi means "offices" in Italian), built by Giorgio Vasari at the behest of the first Tuscan Grand Duke.

Hotel: Hotel Midas Roma or similar **Meals:** Breakfast

DAY 16 Rome – Vatican (08.06)

Due to the fact that buses are not allowed to enter the restricted zone of Rome (ZTL), a guided tour of downtown Rome will be given to the guests on foot or by public transportation.

The Colosseum (self-pay inside visit), one of the most famous buildings in Ancient Rome, is also one of the largest ancient amphitheatres in the world. It was built by Emperor Vespasian between 70 and 80 AD to accommodate a variety of public entertainments. The Roman Wishing Fountain (exterior visit), also known as the Trevi Fountain, is one of the most famous fountains in the world. According to tradition, tossing a coin with your back to the fountain can help find love. The fountain is famous for its magnificent Baroque art style and exquisite sculptures. One of the Vatican's landmarks is St. Peter's Basilica (exterior visit), one of the largest Catholic churches in the world. Its dome and sculptures attract numerous pilgrims and tourists.

DAY 17 Rome ✈️ Next Destination (08.07)

After breakfast, transfer to Rome-Fiumicino International Airport (FCO) for your next destination (transfer time: 8:00 AM). **Meals:** Breakfast
