DAY 1 Milan

Arrive at Milan Malpensa Airport (MXP).

Free leisure time; guests are responsible for making their own way to the hotel.

DAY 2 Milan-Verona

Duomo di Milano, Located in the centre of Milan, the Duomo di Milano occupies the site of the original church of Santa Maria Nasco En de Maggio and is the city's landmark. This church is a masterpiece of Gothic architecture, with its elegant and stately architecture. (external visit)

Galleria Vittorio Emanuele II, A famous shopping centre in the centre of Milan, Italy, known as the 'living room of Milan'. It is one of the oldest shopping centres in the world and one of the most iconic buildings in Milan.

Verona Arena (external visit) A remarkably well-preserved Roman amphitheater from the 1st century AD, still used today for opera performances and concerts. It is one of the largest and most famous ancient arenas in Italy.

Juliet's House (external visit) Famous for the balcony associated with Shakespeare's Romeo and Juliet, visitors come here to see the balcony, the statue of Juliet, and leave love notes on the walls.

Piazza delle Erbe (external visit) The historic heart of Verona, this lively square is surrounded by colorful medieval buildings, markets, cafés, and fountains, offering a vibrant atmosphere for sightseeing and relaxation.

DAY 3 Venice - Pisa

Piazza San Marco, one of the most famous squares in Venice, is considered the centre of the city. The square is home to St. Mark's Basilica and bell tower, one of Venice's most important religious and cultural landmarks.

St. Mark's Basilica, one of the grandest churches in Venice, known for its Byzantine and Gothic architectural styles as well as its gilded interior.(external visit)

Ponte dei Sospiri, Connect the Doge's Palace with the New Prison. Because it is said that when prisoners were taken to the prison, they would sigh at the view of Venice from the bridge.

One of **Pisa's** most famous attractions is the **Leaning Tower of Pisa**, a white marble-built bell tower famous for its pronounced tilt. The Leaning Tower is part of Pisa Cathedral and together they form Piazza dei Miracoli.

DAY 4 Pisa - Florence - Rome

Santa Maria del Fiore one of Florence's most famous buildings, known for its massive dome and magnificent façade. (external visit)

Uffizi Gallery (self-pay inside visit) • built in 1560. It began as the offices of the Municipal Judiciary (Uffizi means 'offices' in Italian), built by Giorgio Vasari at the behest of the first Tuscan Grand Duke,

DAY 5 Rome - Vatican - Rome

Due to the fact that buses are not allowed to enter the restricted zone of Rome (ZTL), a guided tour of downtown Rome will be given to the guests on foot or by public transportation.

The Colosseum (self-pay inside visit), one of the most famous buildings in Ancient Rome, is also one of the largest ancient amphitheatres in the world. It was built by Emperor Vespasiani between 70 and 80 AD to accommodate a variety of public entertainments.

The Roman Wishing Fountain (external visit), also known as the Trevi Fountain, is one of the most famous fountains in the world. According to tradition, tossing a coin with your back to the fountain can help find love. The fountain is famous for its magnificent Baroque art style and exquisite sculptures. One of the **Vatican's** landmarks is **St. Peter's Basilica**, one of the largest Catholic churches in the world. Its dome and sculptures attract numerous pilgrims and tourists (external visit).

DAY 6 Rome - Pompeii - Naples

Pompeii (self-pay inside visit) • an ancient Roman city near Naples, famously buried by the eruption of Mount Vesuvius in 79 AD. Its remarkably preserved ruins, including houses, temples, theaters, and frescoes, offer a unique glimpse into daily life in Roman times.

Castel Nuovo (External Visit) A historic medieval fortress built in the 13th century, located near the city center. Famous for its impressive architecture, triumphal arch, and rich history.

DAY 7 Naples - Capri / Sorrento - Rome

Depart from Naples by ferry to the beautiful island of **Capri**.

Blue Grotto (self-pay inside visit) — one of Capri's most iconic natural wonders. The Blue Grotto is a sea cave where sunlight passes through an underwater opening, creating a magical blue glow inside.

If the ferry service is canceled due to weather conditions, the itinerary will be changed to a visit of Sorrento instead.

DAY 8 Rome - Next destination

After breakfast, transfer to the Rome-Fiumicino International FCO Airport for your journey to the next destination. (drop-off time 8:00 am)

- Service fee for driver and guide (mandatory, please have change ready), €10 per person per day. Total 80 euros, children are the same price as adults
- **Compulsory items (150USD/person):**
 - Venice boat ticket to and from the island • Venice sightseeing tax, Capri round-trip ferry tickets • Italy city fee.

Self-paid items:

- Uffizi Gallery entrance fee and audio guide: 55€/person,
- Colosseum entrance fee and audio guide: 31€/person ,
- Venice Grand Canal: 40€/person (Starting from 8 persons),
- Venice Gondola: 40€/person (starting from 2 persons),
- Rome in-depth tour (including St. Peter's Basilica) 70 euros / per person (8 people into the group)
- Meal cost reference: Chinese group meal (6 dishes and 1 soup): €25 per person (minimum 8 people); Italian specialty meal: €45 per person
- Additional Paris pick-up: 1-3 people: 150€/trip, 4-6 people: 180€/trip; 7 and more people consult separately.
